Cinco de Mayo is a festive holiday celebrated every year on May 5th with parades, piñatas, music, and Mexican food. Contrary to popular belief, Cinco de Mayo did not commemorate Mexico's liberation from Spain, as Mexico had already been independent for over 50 years. Instead, it originated in 1861 when President Juarez declared that Mexico could not pay its debts to multiple countries. This led to France sending troops to annex the region as French territory on May 5, 1862. Despite being greatly outnumbered, Mexican soldiers, led by General Ignacio Zaragoza, fought and won back Mexico utilizing their knowledge of the terrain and patriotic spirit.

Additionally, every second Sunday of May, we celebrate and show appreciation to mothers nationwide for their unconditional love. They are a force that keep us moving and help us in all areas of life. LNESC CELEBRATES 50 YEARS IN CREATING LIFELONG LEARNERS 1973 - 2023







The LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC) is commemorating the 50th anniversary in providing education and leadership programs for Hispanic and minority students. Through the efforts of 16 education service centers across the U.S., including Puerto Rico, and a host of national programs, we proudly celebrate the positive impact on the future leaders of our communities.

LNESC has assisted over 607,000 students on their path to higher education. With the support of partnerships representing many sectors, including 90 school partners, the LNESC national office, along with 16 education centers have:

- Annually served 14,000 students through education and leadership programs
- Awarded over \$30 million in scholarship funds to-date
- Sent 159,000 students to post-secondary education to-date
- Provided training and leadership development opportunities to over 550 students to-date through the Washington Youth Leadership Seminar
- Received the highest number of Department of Education TRIO program awards than any other non-profit organization or postsecondary institution

Power of Education: Strategies for Student Success


