As such, the holiday's origin is Christian, but as time went on it became a shared time for everyone to celebrate the new life that spring brings every year.

Today, the holiday boasts a plethora of traditional activities that remind people of the joys of spring. The activities embrace symbols of new life and include picnics, painting Easter eggs, and spending time at a petting zoo with baby chicks and bunnies.

Through the efforts of 16 education service centers across the U.S., including Puerto Rico, and a host of national programs, we proudly celebrate the positive impact on the future leaders of our communities.

LNESC has assisted over 607,000 students on their path to higher education. With the support of partnerships representing many sectors, including 90 school partners, the LNESC national office, along with 16 education centers have:

- Annually served 14,000 students through education and leadership programs
- Awarded over \$30 million in scholarship funds to-date
- Sent 159,000 students to post-secondary education to-date
- Provided training and leadership development opportunities to over 550 students to-date through the Washington Youth Leadership Seminar
- Received the highest number of Department of Education TRIO program awards than any other non-profit organization or postsecondary institution
