FELIZ DÍA DE SAN PATRICIO Y MES DE LA HISTORIA DE LA MUJER

Lunes, 6 de marzo de 2023

En 1987, se hizo la primera Proclamación Presidencial que declaró la primera semana de marzo como un momento para crear conciencia sobre las contribuciones de las mujeres a la sociedad. Comenzó como una celebración de una semana de las contribuciones de las mujeres a la cultura, la historia y la sociedad organizada por el distrito escolar de Sonoma, California. Unos años más tarde, la celebración pasó a ser reconocida por otras comunidades, distritos escolares y organizaciones de todo el país.

Para 1980, el presidente Jimmy Carter emitió la primera proclamación presidencial declarando la semana del 8 de marzo como la Semana Nacional de la Historia de la Mujer. Al año siguiente, el Congreso aprobó una resolución estableciendo una celebración nacional. Finalmente, seis años después, el Proyecto Nacional de Historia de la Mujer solicitó con éxito al Congreso que ampliara el evento a todo el mes de marzo.

LNEsc también se complace en celebrar el Día de San Patricio, que cae durante la temporada cristiana de Cuaresma. Las familias irlandesas tradicionalmente asistían a la iglesia por la mañana y celebraban por la tarde.



LNESC CELEBRATES 50 YEARS IN CREATING LIFELONG LEARNERS 1973 - 2023



The LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC) is commemorating the 50th anniversary in providing education and leadership programs for Hispanic and minority students. WHAT IS FENTANYL?

It is a prescription drug that is also made and used illegally. Like morphine, it is a medicine that is typically used to treat patients with severe pain, especially after surgery. It is also sometimes used to treat patients with chronic pain who are physically tolerant to other opioids. Tolerance occurs when you need a higher and/or more frequent amount of a drug to get the desired effects.

In its prescription form, fentanyl is known by such names as Actiq®, Duragesic®, and Sublimaze®.

Synthetic opioids, including fentanyl, are now the most common drugs involved in drug overdose deaths in the United States.

National Institute on Drug Abuse

What to do if you think someone is overdosing

- 1 Call 911 Immediately.
- 2 Administer naloxone (narcan).
- 3 Try to keep the person awake and breathing.
- 4 Lay the person on their side to prevent choking.
- 5 Stay with the person until emergency assistance arrives.

FACTS

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that is about 50 to 100 times stronger than morphine.

Fentanyl is the single deadliest drug threat our nation has ever encountered.



LEARNING

Illicit Manufactured Fentanyl (IMF)

- Is available on the drug market in different forms, including liquid and powder.
- It looks like any drug.
- It's mixed with drugs like heroin, cocaine, and methamphetamine and made into pills that resemble other opioids.



STRATEGIES TO PREVENT YOUTH FROM USING DRUGS



- Be honest and direct
- Give them praise
- Make one-on-one time
- Keep your cool
- Connect with other parents



- Make sure they know the legal circumstances of using drugs



- Volunteer at a substance abuse treatment center or a homeless shelter
- Do your homework
- Give them the facts
